EDUCATOR EMERGENCY RISK ASSESSMENT

A risk assessment must be conducted to identify potential emergencies that are relevant to the service. This must be reviewed at least every 12 months and as soon as practicable after becoming aware of any circumstance that may affect the safe evacuation of children from the service and updated accordingly (Regulation 97).

Your Emergency Risk Assessment will include typically recognised emergency situations, as well as particular threats or hazards that may be specific to your educator service.

Consider where your premises are located, any possible threats or hazards in the vicinity and surrounding community, and any incidents that may have occurred before. Liaise with relevant emergency authorities if needing particular advice for your context - list of national and NSW relevant authorities - resource.
