EMBARKING ON A NEW PLAN FOR POOCHES

With more than 92,000 registered dogs in Lake Macquarie, it's important to balance the open space needs of pet owners and the general public. That's why we've adopted a Dogs in Open Space Strategy, to establish a fair shared environment for canines, their carers and the community at large. The 10 year-plan identifies up to 10 new off-leash areas across the city, while tweaking the boundaries at some existing off-leash sites to better suit all users. BULK CHANGES FOR BULKY WASTE

The way we collect bulky waste is about to change.

Council is poised to switch from a scheduled suburb-wide bulky waste service to a more flexible, bookable system in a bid to clean up streets, reduce landfill and save ratepayers money.

Manager Waste Services Paul Collins said the switch was not a reduction in service.

"A bookable service means people have more flexibility to get their bulky waste collected when it's most convenient to them," he said.


"That might be when they're moving house, when they're doing spring cleaning or when their bulky goods no longer work and are beyond repair."

Households will choose either two kerbside collections, two drop-off vouchers to Awaba Waste Management Facility or a combination of both in a 12 month period.

FLUORO FLEET RETURNS



The spectacular sight of neon light on the water by night will crystallise across Lake Macquarie when the annual 'Float Your Boat' fleet sets sail in June.

The open competition, in which boat owners dress their vessels with dazzling lights in pursuit of cash prizes, will swan by Toronto, Coal Point and Wangi Wangi on Friday 23 June, followed by Warners Bay, Eleebana, Valentine and Belmont on Saturday 24 June.

Spectators can line the shores of Toronto and Warners Bay foreshore live sites to enjoy the cascade of colour, along with live music, roaming illuminated performances, entertainment, children's activities and food trucks from 5-9.30pm each evening.
