

Lake Macquarie City Council has invested heavily in solar solutions to help provide affordable, sustainable power around our city – and so can you!

For residents and businesses there are financial and environmental gains to be made by adopting solar and going electric.

The best way to run your home - for your wallet and the climate - is with all electric appliances and cars powered by clean electricity. It's half the running costs of a fossil fuel home.

Here at Council, we're looking to lead the charge in this space.

We have established solar systems at more than 40 locations, reducing our carbon emissions by more than 2000 tonnes per year and saving the community half a million dollars every year in electricity charges.

Council has also supported the installation of solar, battery and diesel generator back-up systems at three emergency response facilities through more than \$2 million in grant funding.

We continue to electrify our vehicle fleet, supported by a 175-kilowatt carpark system in Speers Point, which was a finalist at the Local Government NSW Environment Awards 2022.

Council has deployed charging stations across the city to increase the viability of electric vehicles (EV), with sites at

Council headquarters, Speers Point Park, Blacksmiths Beach Holiday Park, Lake Macquarie Landcare, Swansea Lakeside Holiday Park, Toronto Commercial Centre and the Swansea Centre.

We had our first Community EV Open Day in May to showcase the technology and its benefits, and we're about to start a 12-month power pole street charging trial to support the uptake further.

Our Living Smart Festival in September was another wonderful celebration of all things sustainable, and a great opportunity for people to learn how to make small changes to save both money and our precious environment.

If you're looking for ways to get started, Council provides access to a solar and battery estimating tool to the community free of charge at sunspot.org.au.

Commercial property owners who are seeking to make their buildings more energy and water efficient - including with solar - can apply for favourable financing through an Environmental Upgrade Agreement at lakemac.com.au/environmental-upgrades.

or not, make sure to soak up some sun, get outdoors, go for a swim and enjoy the beauty of Lake Macquarie.

## ARE YOU PREPARED FOR BUSH FIRE SEASON?

- 4. **KEEP** key information close at hand

# LEAD MITIGATION GRANTS NOW AVAILABLE

Applications are open for eligible residents, including tenants, for funding to assist with lead mitigation on their property.

The Lead Mitigation Grant Program provides funding to eligible households that may have been impacted by lead contamination from the former Pasminco Cockle Creek Smelter.

Led by the NSW Government through the Environment Protection Authority, the grants can help with the cost of lead remediation and mitigation activities. Properties shaded in purple on the map may be eligible for support.
