Policy

Objectives

To outline Council's administration arrangements for the use of Council flags, including flags flown as an expression of Council's governance responsibilities.

Policy Statement

1 Flying flags outside the Administration Centre

Council will always fly the Australian National, the State of New South Wales, the City of Lake Macquarie, and the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander flags. All flags will be raised no earlier than first light and lowered no later than dusk.

The flag should always be flown freely and as close as possible to the top of the flagpole with the rope tightly secured.

Two flags should not be flown from the same flagpole.

Flags should not be flown if damaged, faded or dilapidated.

In the instance of a visit from a Sister City to the City of Lake Macquarie, the State of New South Wales flag will be replaced in accordance with Section 2.

In the instance of a sanctioned visit by foreign dignitaries to the City of Lake Macquarie, the State of New South Wales flag will be replaced in accordance with Section 3.

2 Flying flags in the Council Chambers

Council will fly the Australian National, the Aboriginal, the Torres Strait Islander, the State of New South Wales, and the City of Lake Macquarie flags in the Council Chambers.

3 Flying flags of sister cities

Council will fly the national or city flag of its sister cities during visits by the Mayor (or his or her delegate) of a sister city.

4 Flying flags of other countries

Council will only fly the national flags of other countries during a visit by a foreign dignitary, when the visit is organised in consultation with Council.

5 Flying Flags at Half-Mast

Council will fly its flags at half-mast as a sign of mourning on appropriate occasions at the discretion of the General Manager or his or her delegate.
